Scoring System

Score	Description	Additional Guidance on Strengths/Weaknesses
5	Outstanding	Strong with negligible weaknesses
4	Very Good	Strong but with numerous minor weaknesses
3	Satisfactory	Some strengths but also some moderate weaknesses
2	Marginal	A few strengths and a few major weaknesses
1	Poor	Very few strengths and numerous major weaknesses

Reviewers are asked to consider each application and give a separate score for each criterion (using 1 to 5 scoring range).

This scoring system uses a 5-point scale for each scoring criteria:

- A score of 5 indicates a strong application with essentially no weaknesses
- A score of 1 indicates an application with serious and substantive weaknesses with very few strengths
- A score of 3 is considered an average application for the career stage and research area
- Ratings are in whole numbers only (no decimal ratings).
